### **Music Musings**

In September music classes, Kindergarten students sing lots of vocal exploration songs and learn to play everybody's favorite game: Bee Bee Bumble Bee!

First graders learn to read and write quarter notes (ta), eighth notes (ti-ti), and quarter rests (sh).

2nd Graders work on reading and writing 2 pitch songs (sol-mi) and 3 pitch songs (sol-mi, la). We also learn to play the songs on xylophones.

3rd Graders learn how to read the notes on the staff and begin playing recorders!

4th Graders have reviewed how to play 3 note songs on recorders and go from there.

5th Graders worked on describing music by listening to the "Overture Candide" and learned about Leonard Bernstein, the great American Composer.

Our DMCS 5th Grade Band is 26 members strong and has already starting working on music for the Christmas Concert!

All students review songs for Mass in preparation for leading the music at school Masses!
