I am happy that you see the value in reproducing your child's art work for them, yourselves, and other special people in your child's life. Thank you for supporting the art department!

This month in Art and Library classes, we are fortunate to have the opportunity to share the Art Adventures program with every class. The materials are provided by the Minnesota Institute of Art and sponsored by the PTO. This year's theme is "*Dress for the Occasion*". Please ask your students what they learned.

We are currently working on a variety of projects in the art room. Kindergarteners are creating 2-D buildings out of popsicle sticks. They have painted the buildings and will be adding their final details with markers. First graders have been creating 3-D paper sculptures. Second and third graders are painting flowers and buildings using a piece of bendable cardboard and black paint. These are being colored in using oil pastels and water colors. Fourth graders are finishing up weaving bowls. Fifth graders are weaving and creating linoleum prints

Has your child mentioned earning ninja belts for jump roping? Ask him or her about it! We have been jumping through April learning many jump rope skills made fun through our Jump Rope Ninja program.

Students in kindergarten readiness and kindergarten have been working on jumping with hoola hoops and jump ropes. Their goal is to jump and turn a rope one time, which earns them a "baby belt."

Students in first and second grades have been working on jumping forward and backward with a short jump rope, along with jumping a long jump rope with my help. Most students have earned their "white belts," jumping five or more times, along with jumping backwards.

Third grade students have been performing jump rope tricks, while fourth and fifth graders have put together some fantastic jump rope routines!


