
ART NEWS

This month DMCS artists have been happily creating and learning! New to art class this year our Kindergarten Readiness students have begun to explore paint. They love mixing colors and the joy on their faces when they are painting is priceless!

Kindergarten students just finished creating their primary color shape paintings.

First graders created mixed media (chalk and tempera paint) landscapes inspired by the artist Wolf Kahn.

Second and third grade artists created fall collages while learning about space (foreground, middle ground, and background). They also explored texture and practiced overlapping.



Fifth graders completed their self-portrait collages made from newspaper, magazines, paint, and markers. They are working on contour line drawing and had fun trying to draw their hands without lifting their markers. We had some good laughs at how wacky our drawings looked, mine included!

October has brought us tons of fun and learning in Physical Education!

Preschool through grade five students have been working on throwing and catching. It is key that students are learning to throw using the critical elements. Kindergarten Readiness and Kindergarten classes are learning to throw underhand, using "point, step, tic-

toc." First
through fifth
grade students
are learning and
perfecting the
overhand throw
using the critical
elements, such as
the arm back and
extended, with
the elbow

leading, stepping with opposite foot, and following through toward the target and across the body.

We have introduced the components of fitness for kids in grades three through five. They ran the "pacer" assessment to assess their cardio-respiratory endurance. We will do this again in the winter and spring, so they can measure their progress and see if they are meeting their goal of increasing their endurance. We are also working on other fitness components, such as flexibility, muscular strength, and muscular endurance.

We will wrap up the end of October with some fun Halloween activities, stations, and obstacle courses.
