introduction

WELCOME BACK!

Divine Mercy Catholic School leadership, staff, and parents worked throughout the summer to develop a Pandemic Preparedness and Response Plan (PPRP) that addresses the health and safety of our school this fall. This plan relies on guidance from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) protocols for implementation of mitigation strategies in the re-opening of schools. This booklet is a summary of the PPRP document.

We have planned for three scenarios this school year and will be responsive to changing circumstances. As a school community, we will need to be prepared to follow the guidelines and work through any new information or State mandates. Divine Mercy will rely on guidance from the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis as we address the 2020-2021 school year and be prepared to adjust our protocols as needed.

Planning for all scenarios: Opening with Scenario 1

SCENARIO 1: *IN-PERSON WITH SOME RESTRICTIONS*

Students report to school daily-following health and safety precautions (students with health-related concerns supported virtually)

SCENARIO 2: IN-PERSON AND ONLINE HYBRID

Homeroom #1 reports Monday and Tuesday, Homeroom #2 reports Thursday and Friday. Mass on Wednesday (online or in-person), staff meetings, students meet with teachers online throughout the day.



SCENARIO 3: DISTANCE LEARNING

Students learn at home with a revised and expanded distance learning platform.


HOW WE WILL COMMUNICATE WITH YOU

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Divine Mercy Catholic School is dedicated to the health and safety of its students and faculty. Through frequent cleaning, sanitizing, and health screenings we will work to mitigate risks of exposure to COVID-19. Teachers will educate students on respiratory etiquette, proper hand washing techniques, and physical distancing procedures, then monitor that these practices occur in their classroom family pods.

DAILY LIFE AT DIVINE MERCY CATHOLIC SCHOOL

We believe that the best education occurs when students and teachers are face to face; where they can interact and learn while building strong relationships. At Divine Mercy Catholic School we are committed to maintaining as authentic a classroom experience as possible while utilizing multiple strategies to mitigate the risk of transferring the virus.



Classrooms will function as small family pods. Room arrangements will allow for physical distancing as much as possible.



Students will still attend
Phy-Ed and have recess
and lunch outside of their
classroom. Outdoor activity
will be utilized as much as
possible.



Under current state mandate, masks are required. However, students will be allowed mask breaks when physically active or eating.



K-5 students will enter and exit the building through doors 2 and 3. Preschool students will enter and exit through class specific doorways.



Hand sanitizing stations will be posted at the doorways and in the lunchroom to provide easy access.



Our lunchroom staff will be providing pre-plated hot lunch each day. Students are welcome to bring a cold lunch if they wish.



Staff and students will attend weekly Mass. All protocols followed at Sunday Masses will remain in effect.



Students will attend lunch and daily recess within their classroom family pod. They will be required to wash hands immediately after.



Sports programs are sponsored by Bethlehem Academy and will follow their guidelines.



For now, large group assemblies will be hosted virtually.



DMCS students transported by bus will follow the guidelines provided by Faribault Transportation.



Visitors will be limited and will not be allowed outside of the front vestibule. We request appointments so that staff is prepared.

Routine cleaning and disinfecting of classroom surfaces, restrooms, lunchrooms, meeting rooms and drop-off and pickup locations.




MAINTAINING HEALTHY OPERATIONS


A VISION OF HOPE
