## **Music Musings**



#### **ART NEWS**

Greetings from the art room. Your children have been creating and stretching their imaginations, taking risks and trying new things. The art room is a happy place!



Kindergarteners painted concentric circles with watercolors and added details with black colored pencil. They painted fall trees after examining real bark. K students also completed a collage made up of all squares.

Our first graders finished some houses made from craft sticks that they started last year. They created Wolf Kahn inspired 2D pieces using chalk and tempera paint.

The second graders used oil pastels to draw some awesome pumpkins and created fall collage pictures.

Third grade students experimented with India ink to make black and white design papers. These papers were used in combination with other colored papers to create 2D animal pictures.

In fourth grade we examined trees and how they really look without leaves. The students created a colorful background with tissue paper and cut 2D trees out of construction paper using the information they learned about trees. Fourth grade also decorated their art sketchbook covers with colorful tape.

Fifth graders took a break from drawing to try a new technique with cardboard. They chose to either build up the cardboard or cut into it to create a layered piece of work. Some students used a combination of both techniques and the results were awesome! They finished the pieces with paint and oil pastels.
