Kindergarten Readiness students have been exploring Model Magic and created Jesus on the cross and an Easter garden piece with Model Magic flowers.

Our kindergarten students have created some beautiful 2D floral pictures by stamping with corks and pencil erasers.

First graders are working on creating their first floral still-life watercolors. They are trying to really look at what they see and include shadows.

In second grade students painted some amazing Cityscapes and are currently creating large floral watercolors. We are working on overlapping and trying to add some dimension to the pictures.

Third grade recently finished some abstract shape 2D pictures. They learned about overlapping and tints. Third graders learned about the artist Vincent Van Gogh. They created a background using tints and are using Model Magic to create 3D flowers.

Fourth graders are working on creating their portfolios. They are using one-point perspective to create a cover for their folder.

Our fifth graders have been working to carve their linoleum tiles for their printmaking lesson. They are learning how to print multiple prints and the techniques needed to print successfully.
